

# Saddam Hussein Remote Viewing Experiment

# Mobius Protocol

- Data collected in “Free Response” mode
- Multiple Viewers (47) contributed data
- Unimpeachable chain of chronology established
- Double blind – neither Schwartz, the viewers, nor anyone else in the U.S. knew the answers to the challenge on 3 November 2003
- Consensus, Concept, & Low *A Priori* Analysis

# Analysis

- Two categories of impressions given particular consideration:
  - 1.) points of consensus concerning the physical location; and,
  - 2.) what are called low *a priori* observations (things which are very unlikely to be predictable, such as details about Hussein's appearance on the day of his capture)

# Predictions

- Saddam will be found beneath an ordinary looking house on the outskirts of a small village near Tikrit. The house will be part of a small compound that is bordered on one side by a dirt road and, on the other, by a nearby river.

- “Saddam was found near the village of Adwar in the Tikrit area in a small compound...a river runs nearby, and a road is in front of the compound.”

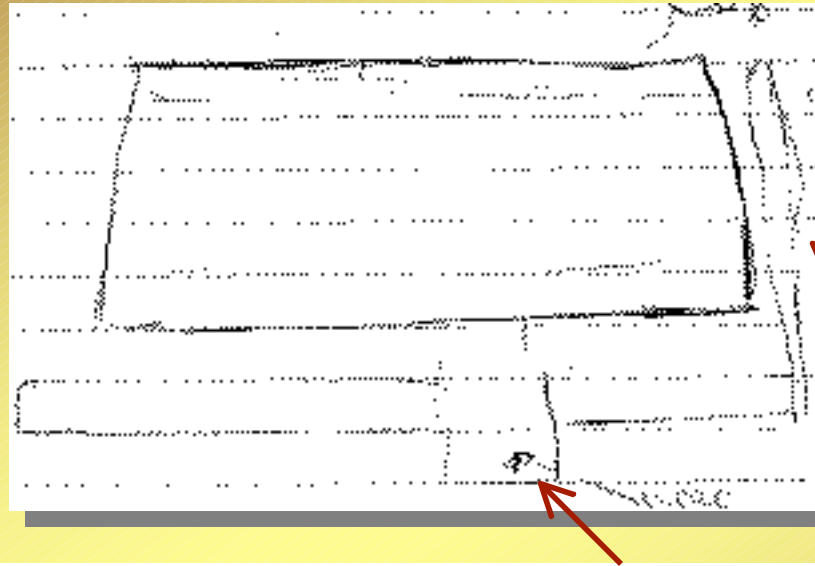

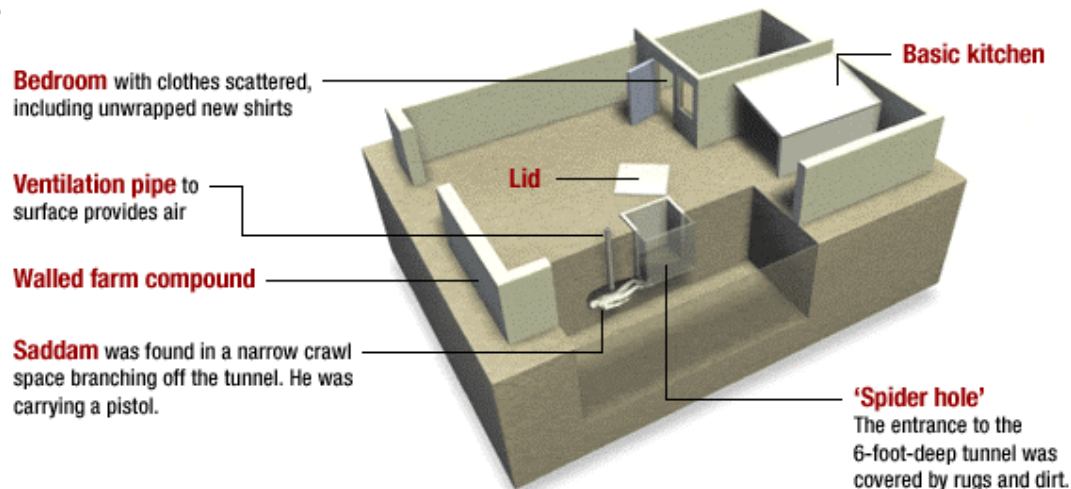
# The House



# Saddam Hussein Hiding Place



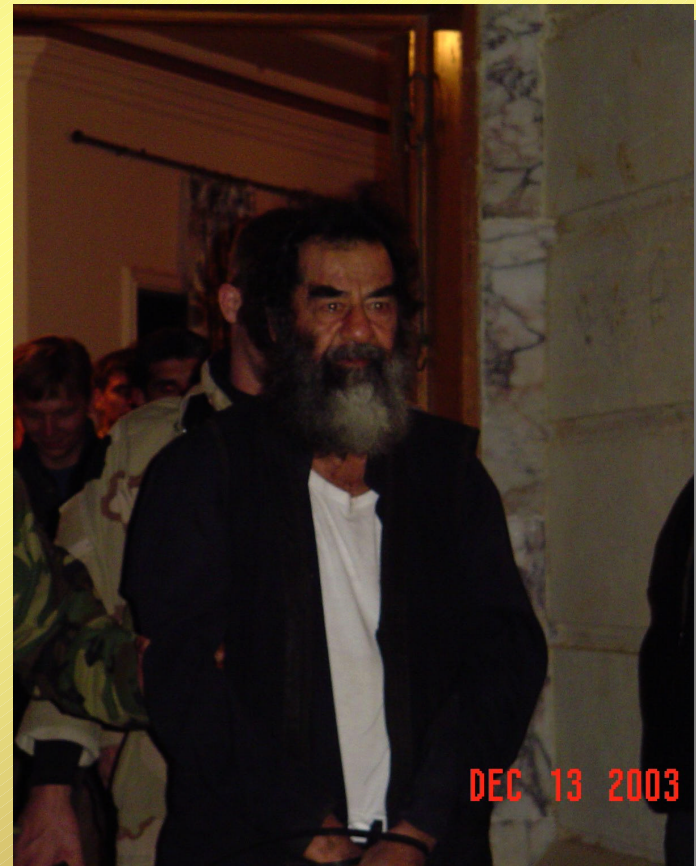
Saddam Hussein was captured on Saturday in an underground hideout on a farm in Adwar, 10 miles from his hometown of Tikrit. He was taken by U.S. troops without a single shot being fired, even though he carried a pistol.

# Predictions Concerning Saddam's Appearance

- Look like a homeless person
- Dressed in dark clothing
- Unkempt “ratty” salt and pepper beard
- “Wild” hair
- Disheveled appearance

- He will have only 2 or 3 supporters with him at the time of his discovery.
